



Five reasons for a three-year GCSE

- 1. Pupils will have more chance of getting a better grade
- Pupils will spend more <u>time</u> studying subjects that they will be examined on at the end of year 11
- Pupils will spend more time studying subjects they enjoy
- For year 9 they will be in subject classes with students who, like themselves, have <u>chosen</u> the subjects they are studying



Pathways System

What is a 'Pathway'?



- A 'Pathway' is a way of guiding GCSE Options choices.
- We have three pathways





Albany Pathways System

Green Pathway: These students must take a Language and either History or Geography (around 75% of year 8 cohort). They will have two free GCSE options.

Blue Pathway: These students will study a Language. They will have three free GCSE options.


<u>Purple Pathway</u>: These students will have a broader range of choice in the subjects/courses they pursue for GCSE. They will have up to four free options.



Matching students to pathways

- 1. Use of data
- Current student progress in any given subject
- 3. Professional judgement of teachers
- No pathway is of more 'value' than any other; anyone can opt into the Ebacc pathway


